

- **c common to abundant**, usually found on every visit in moderate to large numbers
- **u uncommon**, usually present in low numbers but may be missed
- o occasional, seen only a few times during a season, not present in all suitable habitat
- **r rare,** one to low numbers occur, but not every year

BIRDING ETHICS

You are invited to enjoy this area for your birding pleasure and to support the protection of this and other important bird habitat.

To avoid stressing birds, exercise restraint during observation, photography, recording, or filming. Never approach a bird so closely as to flush or disturb it. Limit the use of recordings and other methods of attracting birds, and never use such methods for attracting any species of conservation concern, or one that is rare in your local area.

Keep a distance from nesting and feeding sites. In such sensitive areas, if there is a need for extended observation, try to use a blind or hide, and take advantage of natural cover. Use artificial light sparingly for filming or photography, especially for close-ups.

Stay on roads, trails, and paths where they exist; otherwise keep habitat disturbance to a minimum.

Please remember to ensure your vehicle, shoes, and gear are free of weed seeds. The spread of weeds reduces the quality of habitat available to birds and other wildlife.

Be aware of where and how you park your car. Do not block gates, roads, paths, or other access.

Also remember: do not enter any private property without the owner's explicit permission; follow all laws, rules, and regulations governing use of roads and public areas; and practice common courtesy in contacts with other people. Your exemplary behavior will generate goodwill with birders and non-birders alike.

CANYON FERRY WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREA DESCRIPTION

Canyon Ferry Wildlife Management Area includes about 5000 acres consisting of portions of the uplands and shoreline along the Missouri River and Canyon Ferry Reservoir plus the area encompassed by a system of four dikes within the reservoir. Each dike encloses a 400 to 500 acre pond. The dike system was constructed from 1973-78 to address a serious dust problem resulting from wind action on exposed mud flats when the reservoir level was low. About 350 artificial islands were created within the dike ponds for waterfowl nesting. The reservoir, dikes/ponds, river bottom, and upland communities provide habitat for a wide variety of birds and mammal species. Additionally, the broad river valley is a major north/south migration corridor for numerous avian species.

The dike and pond developments on this WMA were constructed by the Federal Bureau of Reclamation, with financial help for island construction provided by the Sportsmen of Montana and Ducks Unlimited. The area is managed by Montana Fish, Wildlife, and Parks, primarily for hunting recreation, but many other recreational activities are accommodated - including birding. Purchasing state and federal migratory bird stamps is an excellent way for non-hunters to contribute to the establishment and management of critically important wildlife areas such as this.

The species included on this list have been observed by the author at least once in over 100 observation trips, reported by FWP personnel, included on the Montana Bird Distribution Database, or recorded by other observers including George Holton, Paul and Juanita Bray, and others. Observations made from roads accessing and surrounding the WMA were also included.
