A list of bird observations already seen in a specific Montana area (e.g., LL, QLL, or QQLL) can be developed by:

- 1. Clicking here: <u>http://mtnhp.org/SpeciesSnapshot/</u>.
- 2. In the upper left corner there is a filter that is defaulted to "Statewide." Click on the down arrow on that filter and select the LL, QLL, or QQLL of interest (*see image right*).

3. If you only want a list of birds, click on the down arrow on the adjacent "All Species" filter and click on "Birds." Similarly, you can filter out species of a particular status with the filter that is currently defaulted to "All Status" (see image right).
