

Montana Audubon Center--Phase 2 Reopening Summer Camp

We look forward to a reopening of select programs at the Center under Phase 2 of the Governor's guidelines, which includes this year's summer camp program. To protect participants, we will be implementing the following protocols:

General:

- Wearing a mask is required for camp attendance (unless they are age 5 or younger).
 Masks will not be worn during snack, running activities, canoeing and times where it isn't feasible. Adults need to wear masks during drop off and pick up.
- Small group sizes: No individual camp will exceed 20 people (including staff).
- Majority of the camp day will be held outside.

Check-in/out:

- Writing utensils will be disinfected after each use.
- Staff will check campers in on a clipboard and ask parents/guardians if their child is feeling well today and if they have been exposed to anyone with COVID 19 symptoms in the last 14 days.
- Parents/guardians should take campers' temperatures before leaving for camp. Staff will record temperatures during check-in and will take temperatures if needed.
 Temperature recording is mandatory for camp attendance.

Sanitization:

- All equipment will be disinfected after each use.
- Campers will wash or sanitize hands upon arrival and departure, and before consuming food.
- All areas of the building will be sanitized regularly.

Other points of interest:

- Parents and families are encouraged to maintain social distancing between themselves and other families, as well as with other camps, during pick-up and drop-off.
- If your camper has knowingly been exposed to someone exhibiting symptoms, or is
 exhibiting symptoms themselves, or has a fever of 100.4 or greater, we ask that they not
 attend programming. We will verify the above for each camper each day. Also, please
 let us know if your child becomes sick after attending programming so that we can inform
 those needed.
- We will not be requiring campers or staff to wear masks. We understand that you may wish for your camper to wear a mask, and they are more than welcome to, but our staff will not enforce their wearing of it during programming.
- We encourage you to have discussions with your camper about appropriate social distancing behavior.
- Building is closed to the public.
